- > Ward's main fields of interest are traffic enforcement issues, risky driving behaviours, young drivers, senior drivers, evaluation research, survey research and epidemiology, safety performance indicators, and implementation of road safety programs.
- > Before working at TIRF, Ward worked for the Behaviour and Policy Department of the Belgian Road Safety Institute (IBSR) from 1999 to 2005, where he served as Head of Research from 2001 to 2005.
- > Ward has authored many reports and articles in the grey literature and the peer-reviewed academic literature (Elsevier h-factor: 20) on a variety of topics including drinking and driving, drugged driving, fatigued driving, distracted driving, cognitive impairment, aggressive driving, senior drivers, graduated driver licensing (GDL), automated vehicles and risk compensation, wildlife vehicle crashes, roadside surveys, survey research and multilevel modeling.
- > During his career Ward has blended academic research with meaningful real-world implementation of proven road safety countermeasures by providing technical assistance to a broad variety of audiences around the world.

- > He received his Ph.D. in Transportation Science from the University of Hasselt in Belgium in 2009.
- > Ward has a Master's degree in Criminology from Ghent University (1999) and a Master's degree in Quantitative Analysis from the Catholic University of Brussels (2001).
- > He taught quantitative methods in criminology as a part-time professor at the University of Ottawa, both in English and French, and has taught multivariate analysis as a Teaching Fellow at the Essex University Summer School. He also served as a guest faculty member at the University of Hasselt where he taught a course on traffic safety.
